Dear Mrs. Patke:

This spring it was necessary to chemically treat Letts Lake to remove a large population of rough fish introduced into the lake by bait fishermen.

Both fingerling and catchable-sized trout have since been planted, and we expect this small lake to provide good fishing next May with the development of the fingerlings planted this year.

This year, because of the chemical treatment of the lake, we planted 7,400 catchable trout between June 9 and July 1 - much more than the normal allotment of 5,000 catchables scheduled for the lake. We had to discontinue planting after July 1 after the water warmed up too much.
