Under the supervision of the Senior Fish Environmental Scientist Supervisor, incumbent helps facilitate the day-to-day operations and maintenance of areas within the North Central Region Conservation Lands Program and assists with habitat improvements on a total of over 80,000 acres of Wildlife Areas and Ecological Reserves. Candidate will work under the direction of the Conservation Lands leadsperson with, and/or leading, one or more seasonal/scientific aides. Incumbent will also perform technical work related to game and nongame species; help manage excessive vegetation control permits; monitor and control public use and install and maintain wildlife-friendly fences and gates. Technician will also inspect areas and report on incompatible uses. Candidate will control (invasive) brush and plant growth by mechanical and chemical means. Inter-and intra-agency coordination is also required.

Specific qualifications and required skills:

Knowledge of methods, materials, and equipment used for wildlife management restoration and rehabilitation techniques in California; methods involved in construction and maintenance work involved in conserving, making, installing, and enhancing, wildlife habitat. Proficiency in improvement methods; general power tools, welding, carpentry, chainsaw and other pruning tools, concrete work, and painting; operation of such equipment as towing and reversing trailers, 4x4 trucks, OHVs, bulldozers, and backhoes.

Either six months of experience in the natural resources field such as parks, forestry, or fish and wildlife, or Completion of one year of college with at least six semester units in the biological sciences may be substituted for the required experience.
