In addition, structure maintenance is performed including a variety of maintenance and repair tasks of buildings, structures, water supply and discharge lines, rearing ponds, water chillers, settling ponds, nursery tanks, incubators, pond screens, settling pond discharge structures and bird enclosures. Landscape and facility maintenance and repair such as weeding, mowing, painting, plumbing, grounds care, sprinkler system, cleaning and maintaining buildings, restrooms and refuse disposal. Equipment maintenance and repair including fish channel Crowder, gates, fish pumps, feeders, sanitation system, fabricating equipment out of wood and metal; operating gas and electrical equipment and hand tools – drills, saws, sanders, utility vehicles, fish pump, electric pallet jack, forklift and various hand held tools.
