Dear Mr. Fraser:


As you perhaps know, I have been interested, both personally and officially, for many years in fish and game matters here in Glenn County.

I have received many inquiries concerning the fish planting program for Glenn County and personally visited the Stony Creek area in the vicinity of Red Bridge and otherwise during the first two days of the fishing season. As usual, there were literally hundreds of fishermen, most of whom were very disappointed although fishing conditions were ideal, except for lack of fish.

In view of the accessibility of Stony Creek and the tremendous fishing pressure, it is my personal thought that this stream should be given much more attention in the fish planting program.

I would appreciate your advising me as to the plans for the present season and in the future. You, of course, may be assured of my full cooperation, particularly with regard to the Department's public relations work in this area.

Dear Mr. Larimer:

This is in reply to your letter of May 5, in which you expressed justifiable concern about the lack of fish planting in Stony Creek.

We had plans for planting in Stony Creek just before the season opened but unfortunately we had an unexpected rainstorm which caused poor road conditions; therefore the planting was postponed.

According to information available in this office, catchable trout should have been planted in Stony Creek this week. The fish are being planted directly from our Darrah Springs Hatchery which is in an isolated location and which does not have telephone communication. Therefore, it is difficult for us to maintain close contact on the plantings made from this installation.

Our Game Warden, Mr. James Hiller, is trying to maintain contact with the hatchery and I am sure that satisfactory plantings have already been made in Stony Creek, or they will be made within the next few days.

Rest assured that we will try to give the Stony Creek area as much attention as we possibly can.
