The Briefing detailed the past history, current problems and future plans as outlined in the attached review. Mr. Carlson and Mr. Patten were both interested in detailing the problem as related to the irrigation district. I repeatedly had to inform the committee that while there were areas of commonality between the D.F. & G. and the G.C.I.D., it was unlikely that the G.C.I.D.'s solution would entirely rectify the fishery problem. I pointed out that it was even possible that any district solution might even cause further damage to the fishery.

The committee members seemed to be in agreement with the proposed solutions and questioned only the timetable for completion. I pointed out that while additional manpower might hasten fabrication of the fish trap, because of some of the experimental portions of

the design I wanted time to test and adjust as necessary. The August 1985 completion date was therefore a more realistic target.

Mr. Warden requested copies and slides of the briefing charts. I will supply him with the requested materials and additionally with a copy of the review.
