**SPILL:** The amount originally reported by the facility has not been amended.

**RESPONSE:** There are crews involved in shoreline clean-up operations at Baker, China, and Ocean Beaches as well as Crissy Field. California Conservation Corps members

have been deployed to Angel Island for shore clean-up of effective beaches

**EQUIPMENT DEPLOYED TODAY:** 

10 vacuum trucks1 open water skimming vessel35 support vessels8 shallow-water skimming vessels

22, 000 feet of boom 1 helicopter to direct skimming

2 boats to capture oiled wildlife. 530 people

**SCAT:** Spill Cleanup Assessment Teams (SCATs) continue to respond to reports of oiled beaches and wildlife in order to evaluate and verify reported information.

WILDLIFE: Species impacted include grebes, loons, gulls, brown pelicans, seals, and a turtle.

22 oiled birds are being cleaned, including 9 brown pelicans.

43 dead birds have been recovered.

13 oiled snowy plovers have been observed at Ocean Beach, DFG has been

attempting to capture them.

12 oiled Harbor seals are continuing to be monitored.

Reports of oiled wildlife should be made to 510-841-9087.

**BEACHES:** All beaches controlled by the National Park Service remain closed except Ocean,

Tennessee Valley, Muir, and Stinson.
